Catrinus Jepma is professor of energy and sustainability at the University of Groningen and professor of economics at the Open University, Heerlen. Since January 2010 he is scientific director of the national research program Energy Delta Gas Research (EDGaR), Europe's larges research program on the role of gas in the energy transition process. Jepma also is scientific director of the EDIaal programme of the Energy Delta Institute.

Elected as Leader of the Council from 2003-2009, she is presently serving as Convener of Enterprise, Planning and Infrastructure.
