Background

Taking a starting point in the first three WP C report, it has been shown that there are vast opportunities for cooperation between ports and their hinterlands. Despite this evidence, companies within the transport industry are often reluctant to share ideas and cooperate with one another. It is thus proposed that C-4b works to explore some of these issues – based on an 'administration and organisation perspective'.
