





A Basic Guide to Online Journey Planners

What is an online journey planner?

Online journey planners are designed to help you find the best method of getting from one location to another. This could be a simple search such as finding a bus to your local shops, or it could be a more complicated journey such as a scenic tour of the Yorkshire Dales.

Why use an online journey planner?

- Most journey planners are able to combine different methods of transport to provide you with the quickest, most accurate route.
- Using an online journey planner avoids the need for multiple bus and train timetables. They are able to work out connections between different services so that you don't have to.
- They are easy to use and can produce a route plan within seconds.
- Journey planners can use your postcode to provide you with a doorto-door route.
- They allow you to specify the time and date that you wish to set off. Many are capable of 'working backwards' and can tell you what time you need to set off to arrive in your destination by a specific time.
- Most journey planners offer you multiple options, allowing you to choose the most appropriate for you.





Which journey planner to use?

With so many journey planners available, how do you know which one to use? Here are a few simple guidelines to help you choose the most appropriate:

- Is your journey entirely within Yorkshire? If yes, then you can use the local journey planner **www.yorkshiretravel.net** see page 3.
- Do you want a door-to-door journey anywhere within the UK? For this you can use **www.maps.google.co.uk** this planner can produce journeys based on postcodes, towns, rail stations and public buildings anywhere in the UK see page 5.
- We are developing a new journey planner for the Yorkshire Dales, called **ShareRoute** it also includes community transport and taxi services – see page 7.

The Basics

The first time you use a new piece of technology it can seem daunting but even if you have never been on the internet before, using a journey planner can be really simple. This guide has chosen some of the most frequently used planners and attempts to explain the basics in a simple user-friendly way.

Remember: no technology is perfect...

Most journey planners work by calculating the quickest journey time. Sometimes this means you get offered a route that involves changing bus or train more times than necessary. Alternatively, it could mean you get offered a 2 minute bus journey that would be easier to walk. Although journey planners can be very useful tools, they are not flawless and you should always examine the different options provided to you before making a decision.

Traveline Yorkshire:

Traveline Yorkshire can produce door-to-door journeys anywhere within Yorkshire, or journeys from anywhere in Yorkshire to a coach or rail station elsewhere in the UK.

Step 1: Go to the following website:

www.yorkshiretravel.net

This website will look like this.



<u>Step 2:</u> If your entire journey is within Yorkshire click here OR

If you want to travel from within Yorkshire to a coach or rail station elsewhere in the UK click here.


This will bring up a screen like the one pictured here.

Step 3: Where are you travelling from and to? Type your origin and destination in the white boxes. For locations within Yorkshire postcodes can be used. When you start typing, a list of potential destinations will appear. If your desired destination is in that list click on it.


Step 4: When do you want to leave? This will automatically search for the next possible journey. Click on the blue arrows to change the time or date.

<u>Step 5:</u> How do you want to travel? You don't usually need to change this but if you wish you can unselect any transport modes you don't want to use.

Step 6: Click on 'Find Journey'




Step 7: The image on the next page shows the results from an example search from an address in Leeds (LS15 0JW) to London Kings Cross Rail Station on the 1st October at 08:00 am.




Google Maps: 5

Google Maps can produce door-to-door journeys anywhere within the UK. It can produce journeys based on postcodes, towns, rail stations and public buildings.


Step 1: Go to the following website: www.maps.google.co.uk - This website will look similar to this:






Step 3: Clicking on the second icon will produce a route using public transport. Type your origin into box A, and your destination into box B.

Step 4: When do you want to leave? This will automatically search for the next possible journey. Click on the blue arrows to change the time or date. You can also specify whether you would like to search using a departure time or an arrival time.



Step 5: To complete your search click on 'GET DIRECTIONS'






A breakdown of Option 1 is listed here (scroll down using the blue bar and arrow to see the whole of the journey).

ShareRoute: 7

ShareRoute is a new journey planner for the Yorkshire Dales which includes local community transport and taxi services, along with timetabled buses and trains. It is still in development but we hope it will be ready by the end of the year.







Booking Train Tickets:

East Coast has a good website for booking tickets for any journey and any train company. There are no booking fees and tickets can be posted to you (for a small postage fee) or picked up for free at any railway station. Some tickets can be printed at home on your own printer.

Step 1: Go to the website www.eastcoast.co.uk – It will look like this:







Step 5: Click on the top left option under 'Fares' on each side to show only the trains with the cheapest advance fares.

Step 6: Click on the 'i' symbol to see the details of each journey including changes Step 7: Click on your preferred outward and return journeys, check the total price and click 'Buy Now'

Step 8: Check all the details and click 'Continue'





Step 9: Choose how you want to receive the tickets. 'Ticket on Departure' means you collect the tickets from a machine at the station by putting in your credit/debit card and entering a code. Once you have decided how to receive the tickets, click 'Continue'

Step 10: Enter your credit or debit card details, tick the box to agree to the terms and conditions, and click 'Buy Now'
