



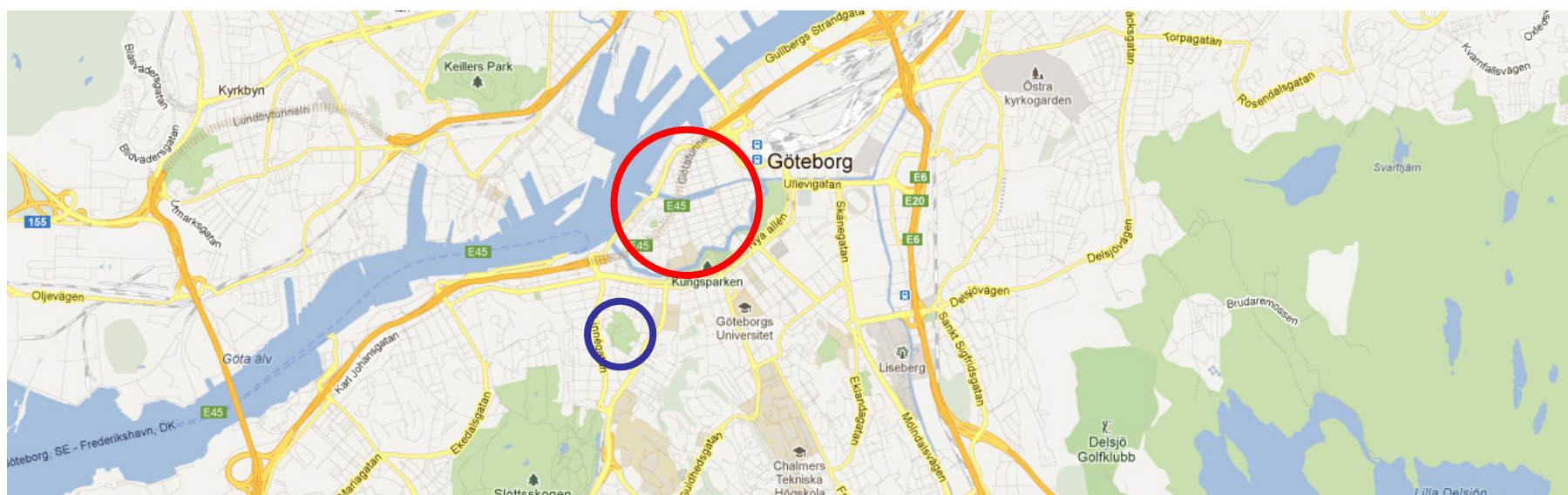

Process

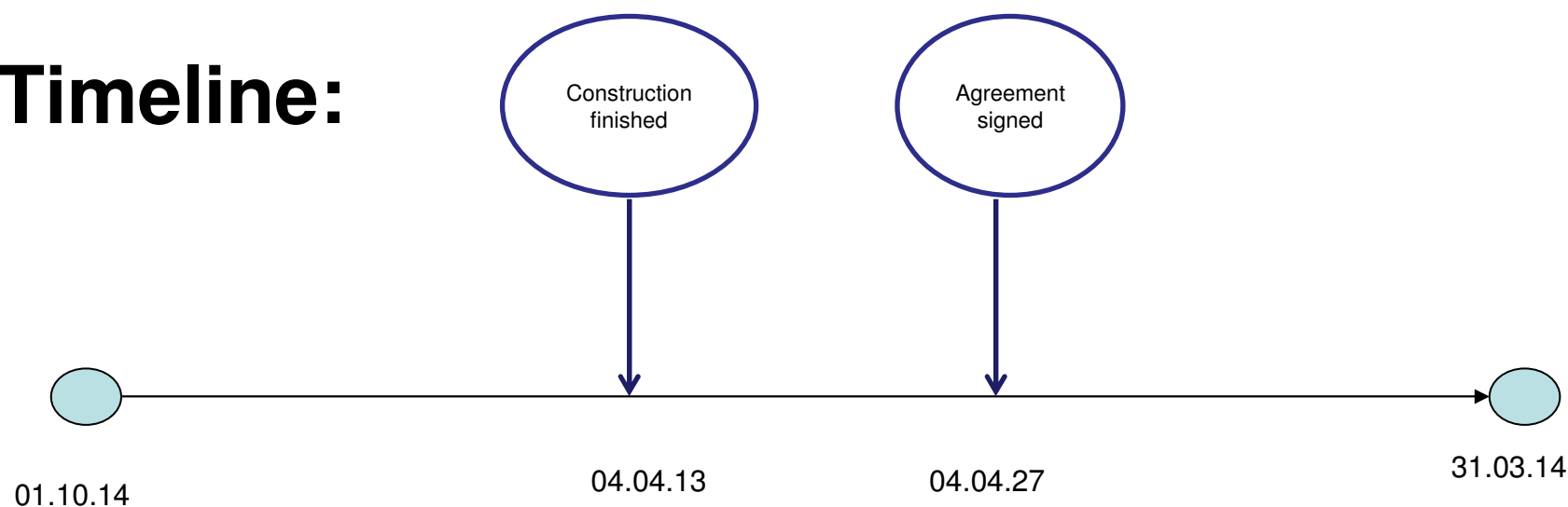


Aim: To complete the construction of the plots and dog exercise yard

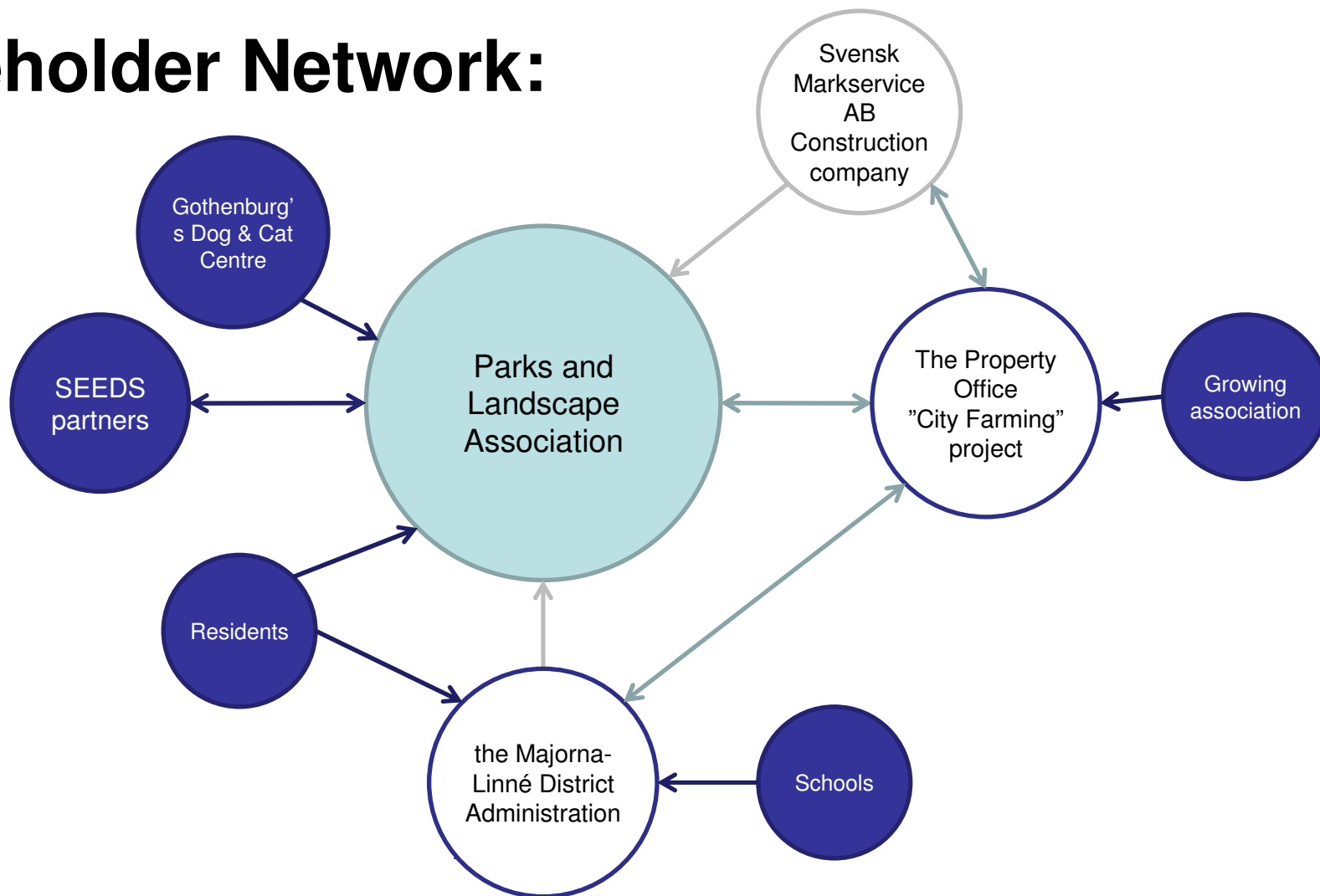

Policy:

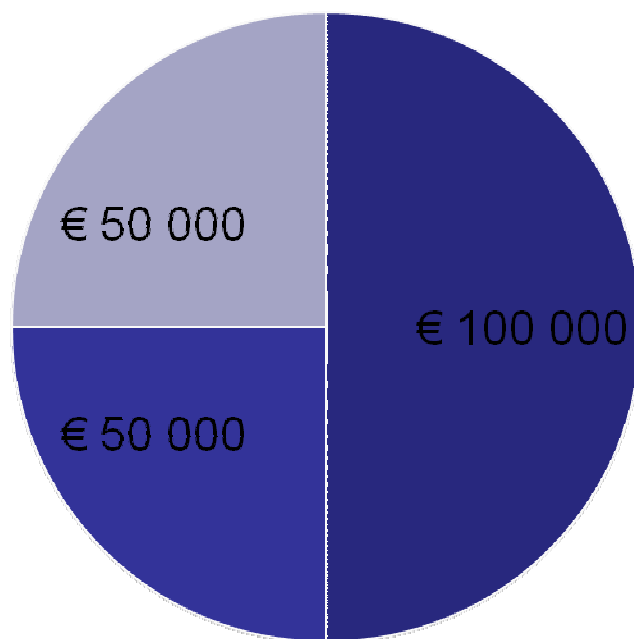
- No legislative barriers and challenges regarding temporary land use – Publicly owned land.
