


# **Finance**







#### Finance:



Think of all your financial resources and where they are coming from eg ERDF, Local Authority, private financing etc, and non-financial resources such as volunteer hours, and put them in this pie chart.

Tell us how you have spent your funding in this period

Tell us if your funding is going to plan, and if it isn't, how do you think you will address this?







#### Finance:

What is the current state of public sector finances? Has this impacted on your project?

There is no money for developing the site as we were used to We have to investigate new models on finance and organization That is why the project is proceeding slowly and there is no substantial development on the site

What is the wider economy like? How has this affected land-use in your project's area? What is the effect on your goals?

There is very little building activity, it will take more effort to start the project and it will probably take a longer period (if ever) to build the housing in the area as planned

#### **Practice:**

On-the-ground progress: What has happened on site, if anything? How are you going to incorporate the landscape of your site? Include lots of pictures! We need to see what has changed

**Pilot development:** How was the pilot designed, what physical problems must you overcome eg contamination?

**Future plans:** Is there a strategy for your pilot's care, or for its handover back to the developer, or for an alternative site for the temporary re-use at handover?
