Achievements from the past

- 4 priorities: no significant gaps in content delivery
- Almost 100% of available funding allocated in 10 calls
- To date: 1030 project partners
- 3 main project types: call 1 to 8 projects ('normal') & clusters and small initiatives on future perspectives + communications
- Average of 2m EUR funding with a range of <1m to 5.6m
- Promoted in Europe and around the world
- Open for policy developments
- 33 projects completed
- Pilots, trials, demonstrations have led to lasting results and additional investments - making an impact on the region and beyond

Towards a new application process

- Main motivations
 - Having an option for submitting a proposal (as first step)
 - To get formal feedback on whether the proposal fits the programme
 - Getting the Steering Committee's views already at idea stage
 - Aim to avoid time and resources used on inappropriate applications
 - Providing preparation costs at an early stage (tbd)
 - To open the door wide for newcomers





Towards a new application process - Forms

- + Builds on the 2007-2013 form
- + With attempts to clarify and simplify
- + In line with EU-wide efforts to harmonise
- + Will be electronic only
- + Will have automatic tools to prevent the most common errors
- + Not yet finalised but...







Towards a new application process -Application preview

- Project summary
- Partnership including relevance and motivation of all partners
- Common challenges, joint approach and need for transnational cooperation
- Objectives, results and main outputs
- Link to other strategies, policies, initiatives and projects
- 'Horizontal principles': Equality, non-discrimination and sustainable dev.
- Work packages, activities and deliverables
- Timeplan (by work package)
- Specification investments and external contracts
- Budget (by partner, by period, by budget line)

Application process for the new programme

- 3 main discussion strands:
- A) Pre-assessment and full application (as is)
- B) Two-step application (ste
- (step 1: Idea Description step 2: Final Application)
- C) Project idea proposals and full applications (mixture of A & B)

Lessons from the past

All projects must be:

- + Based on the shared or complementary needs of all partners
- + Reliant on joint implementation
- + Focused on delivering progress on core programme goals
- + Implementing EU policy
- + Innovative
- + Based on demonstrating and proving what is possible
- + Limited and specific in the changes they seek to generate
- + Inspiring national and regional policy and practices





Regulatory minimums for cooperation

- + 2 partners from at least two countries in the programme area – Expect more extensive programme requirements. Remember the need for a positive outcome for the programme area as a whole
- + Led by a Lead Beneficiary
- + Joint development and implementation A requirement
- + And cooperation on staffing and/or financing
- + Partners from outside NSR –in justified cases Taken from 1299/2013 §12





How it works







Key role of communication

- + Not just websites and leaflets...
- + Briefing meetings with important decision-makers
- + Use of project ambassadors
- + Offering project expertise to external organisations
- + Use of communities in social media
- + Involvement of 'multiplicator' organisations in the project (e.g. European, national and professional institutions)
- + Role of programme initiatives to support communication





Major changes for new programme

- + **Need for focus** On a small number of clearly defined outputs
- + **Need for logic** To explain how each output is necessary to provide the concrete result
- Need for coordination To ensure that the whole partnership understands and supports the project from the start
- + Need for communication To show how project achevements will benefit the wider programme area
- + Need for ambition To target significant change
- + Not just joint implementation Now also joint results





There is no formula for success

- + Programme documents are built on examples Assessments will be based on the results the project expects to deliver
- Indicators are much more important There is a Commission requirement to provide proof of achievements at every level
- Buzzwords and theory quoting Are no substitute for the need to explain clearly and simply what the project wants to achieve and how
- You cannot clone old projects or follow a formula Common needs, joint solutions, genuine willingness to share lessons learned
