The Interreg IVB North Sea Region Programme

2007–2013: To make the North Sea Region a better place to live, work and invest in

- Increase the overall level of innovation taking place across the North Sea Region
- 2. Enhance the quality of the environment in the North Sea Region
- 3. Improve the accessibility of places in the North Sea Region
- 4. Deliver sustainable and competitive communities

About the North Sea Region

The 7 North Sea Programme countries are Sweden, Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, the Flemish Region of Bellgium, the UK and Norway. The region is connected by the North Sea, and the programme area is made up of regions in the 6 member states and Norway that border the North Sea. In size the region covers an area of 664.000 km², 14% of the EU25 area and a population of approprimately 60 Million, 13% of the EU25.
