MARMITE AND SIMILAR PRODUCTS NOT BANNED IN DENMARK

In late May, numerous reports in British media suggested that Marmite had been banned in Denmark. This was soon denied by the Danish Food and Veterinary Administration.



It was an article in *The Guardian* that sparked the huge British interest in the Danish Marmite story.

On May 24th 2011, the *The Guardian* website reported that a Copenhagen store selling foodstuffs from Britain and South Africa had taken Marmite off the shelves. The article alleged that the product had been banned in Denmark because it contained added vitamins.

The article prompted a reaction from the Danish Food and Veterinary Administration.

In its response, the Danish authority made it clear that Marmite had not been banned, but that the shop had failed to file an application to have the product approved for sale in Denmark.

The Danish Food and Veterinary Administration stated:

'Neither Marmite nor Vegemite and similar products have been banned by the Danish Food And Veterinary Administration. However, fortified foods with added vitamins, minerals or other substances can not be marketed in Denmark unless approved by Danish food authorities.

According to the Danish Order on food additives, addition of vitamins, minerals and other substances needs to be approved by the Danish Veterinary and Food Administration before the product can be marketed in Denmark.

The Danish Food and Veterinary Administration has not received an application for marketing in Denmark of Marmite or similar products with added vitamins or minerals.

Other fortified food products have been approved by Danish food authorities and are being marketed in Denmark.'
