

- Smaller-dimension waterways


The waterway network of the North Sea Region is transnational & linked to the sea





Multi-functional use of waterways – Need for balanced approach in waterway management

- Sustainable transport
- Focus for regeneration / economic growth
- Business development esp. tourism
- Promoting health & well-being
- Climate change & ecological management
- Community engagement Third Sector; education etc.

Transnational impacts

- Input to EU policy from a waterway "sectoral" viewpoint eg. "Inland" link to Maritime Policy; NAIADES
- Input to future EU programmes esp. structural funds
- Greater understanding / awareness of how EU agendas impact on the sector & how account of this can be taken in national / regional / local waterway policies & plans
- Possibly leading to Europe-wide strategy for the sector





National / regional impacts

- Waterway management responsibilities vary from country to country with regard to national / regional responsibilities
- However each partner country has waterway policies / strategies at the appropriate level
- Timetable for revision / update of these needs to be taken into account
- Other policies / strategies impact on waterways
 - Eg. Regional economic, spatial, tourism, cultural strategies etc.



National / regional impacts

- Framework for addressing multifunctional use of waterways in national, regional & local policies, strategies & plans
 - Eg. At national level in the UK, through the revision of Defra policy document *Waterways for Tomorrow*

 Ensuring that the multi-functional use of waterways is recognised on other strategies & plans
